In line with FLEP's ongoing humanitarian support project that involves food distribution and school feeding in Kuchingoro IDP Camp Abuja, on Thursday 23rd February 2023, FLEP engaged the women in the camp in a capacity training on food security and sustainability. This activity was carried out as a sustainable holistic measure to make them more productive not just for themselves but for their families and society at large.

The women who are in the IDP Camp as a result of insurgency for more than 10 (ten) years were supported not only with food items (e.g., rice, oil, salt, tomatoes, Maggi seasoning) but were also empowered with different seedlings (okra, Hibiscus Roselle, green vegetable, pepper seedlings) for farming purposes. This is similar to not just giving them fish but also teaching them how to fish for sustainability and productivity. The women were introduced to Greenhouse farming and other forms of farming, and how they can properly manage and secure their food for both home and economic advantage. The women in their large numbers expressed gratitude and according to many of them, "this came at the right time especially these days of harsh economy and hunger, we cannot thank you enough." In excitement, they prayed for more open doors.

For us FLEP, it was indeed a moment of offering selfless service & finding fulfillment.

Commemoration with In the International Day of Zero Tolerance for Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) 2024 with the theme "Her Voice. Her Future. Investing in Survivor-Led Movements to End Female Genital Mutilation", Good Tides Foundation in partnership with FLEP Nigeria organized a sensitization program for the people of Pigba Wasa community in Abuja to educate and enlighten the people on female genital mutilation and it's dangers which could at long-run, lead to death.

Female genital mutilation (FGM) is a traditional harmful practice that involves the partial or total removal of external female genitalia or

other injury to female genital organs for non-medical reasons. The speaker, Lois helped the community to see the dangers of FGM and its adverse effects on a female child.

Practices like FGM has only negative health effect with no positive health benefit and this should be discouraged at all levels. This is a call to collectively put an end to it and all forms of sexual abuses. These things can shorten a female's life span; the adverse effects of female genital mutilation are bleeding, excessive pain, and complications in pregnancy, menstrual pains and death. . FGM is just a traditional practice that has caused more danger to the female gender. The message is simple.

Say no to female genital mutilation and preserve a generation from dying untimely.

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NEW PROJECT ALERT - TAP

We would like to share with you the **Thrive Ahead Project** (TAP), which began in March. The project aims to address the issues of unemployment and underemployment among young people, women, and children, as well as declining spiritual and social values. Some of the socio-economic challenges faced by these groups include generational poverty, limited access to formal education, joblessness among youths, and vocational skills but with a poor mindset on how to use them to overcome poverty.

All of these issues prevent these groups from accessing opportunities to utilize their ideas and energy throughout their lives. Therefore, this project seeks to address some of the problems faced in these communities by focusing on two main areas:

1. Education Empowerment and Integrity Clubs for Children (& Teachers)

We plan to empower two public or private schools located in rural or suburban communities in Abuja that are struggling academically. Our approach involves providing quality teachers to enable children to access quality education for 18 months and beyond with our sustainability plan. Our target students are primary/grade 1 to 5 children, and we will focus on the core subjects of Mathematics and English Language, which form the foundation for other subjects. We also plan to engage the school children in an integrity club where they will learn godly values and character.

2. Economic and Spiritual Empowerment for Young Adults

We aim to assist 40 young individuals in Badagry, Lagos state, who have specific skills but lack the necessary resources to kick-start their businesses. Our objective is to provide them with entrepreneurial training to bridge the gap in their knowledge. Additionally, we plan to offer at least 30 young individuals a business starter pack that contains all the necessary resources to launch their start-ups. In the New Kuchingoro IDP camp, we will support 20 women to improve their trade and farming businesses through cooperative society and Bible study activities. The women will receive starter pack/kits to boost their businesses, leading to financial independence and holistic development.

This program aims to enable individuals to establish their businesses, actively engage in society, train others, and earn a livelihood. This will help them transition from being unemployed to becoming business owners who are devoted to Christ and have a different mindset focused on living their lives for the glory of God. They will also spread the message of Christ among their families, peers, and communities.

The expected outcome of this project is to see people empowered with economic and life skills, leading productive lives, and meeting their needs and the needs of their families. We will keep you informed of project activities and ask for your prayers that the Lord's name may be glorified. May the Lord protect and give wisdom to the project team and stakeholders.
