FROM DEPENDENCE TO DIGNITY:

THE STORY OF THE YOUNG WOMEN IN BAUCHI



Before FLEP RAISE project, many women in Lekka and Luda in Bauchi state had no personal source of income. They depended mainly on their husbands who are farmers for money, even for small household and personal needs. This made it difficult for them to support their children's education, contribute to household expenses, or save for the future.

RAISE Project trained a total of 288 participants. Specifically, 200 participants with women as majority in Lekka and Luda communities. They received training in Good Agricultural Practices (GAP), entrepreneurship, and onion value chain. They learned how to grow onions and turn them into products such as dried onions, onion powder, and onion rings. They were empowered with 240 goats while 88 young persons were trained in Bauchi Metropolis with Entrepreneurship, financial literacy and received Assets of different types including grinding machine, sewing machine, generators, barbing equipment and many more. Today, many of the women in Lekka and Luda communities in Bauchi sell onions and processed onion products in their communities and local markets. Their income now helps them buy household items, support their children's education, and save through their cooperative groups. These women have gained confidence and a stronger sense of value because they can now contribute financially to their families. One participant, Selima Idris, shared:



"Before this project, I depended on my husband for everything. Even when I wanted to buy something small for my child, I had to ask. Today, I earn money from selling dried onions and onion rings. I can support my family and save with my cooperative. My husband now respects my contribution. I feel valued and hopeful for the future."

The RAISE Project has created changes in families and communities and opened opportunities for continued mentoring, discipleship, and spiritual growth. This wider impact reflects FLEP Nigeria's mission to "empower people and communities through holistic development" and contributes to SDGs 1, 2, 5 and 8: No Poverty, Zero Hunger, Gender Equality, and Decent Work and Economic Growth.

CMA Visit To FLEP Nigeria

We were happy to welcome the Regional Programs Coordinator, Magdalene Kelel, and the Finance Manager, Elkanah Karanja, from Children's Mission Africa. They visited our office and our ongoing RAISE Project in Bauchi State to see its progress. In Bauchi, they visited Luda where we have trained 101 participants and Leka 102 participants in crop and livestock farming while in Bauchi metropolis where we have trained 88 participants in entrepreneurship.

During the visit, in Luda and Leka, they met with participants who have begun Grow Assignment with the onion seeds provided through the project, helping them improve their farming skills and support their families. In Bauchi metropolis, participants also shared how entrepreneurship and record-keeping training has helped them improve their businesses and increase their income.



The visit also included a learning session with the FLEP Nigeria team on budgeting, Monitoring and Evaluation, and project planning. It was a valuable opportunity to learn, share ideas, and strengthen our work.

FROM HARDSHIP TO HOPE: SULEIMAN SABO'S JOURNEY TO A BETTER FUTURE

Suleiman 25 years old joined the FLEP's Entrepreneurship Training through the Rural Agricultural Inclusive Skill Empowerment (RAISE) Project. The entrepreneurship training gave him practical skills that changed the way he managed his business. He learned how to keep business records, manage his income, understand his customers, and invest wisely.

After the training, Suleiman began to apply what he had learned. His business started to improve, and his monthly income increased from ₦30,000 to ₦50,000. He bought rechargeable clippers so he could continue working during power outages, and he also bought a rechargeable fan to make his customers more comfortable. Today, he keeps proper business records, manages his money better, and has built a loyal customer base.

Suleiman has been empowered with barbing equipment which includes set of clippers, power Bank, Light and many more worth 100,000 Naira.



Reflecting on his journey, Suleiman says, "After the training and empowerment, I now understand my customers better. I treat them well, and they keep coming back. I now have more customers than before, and I plan to employ someone to help me in the shop."

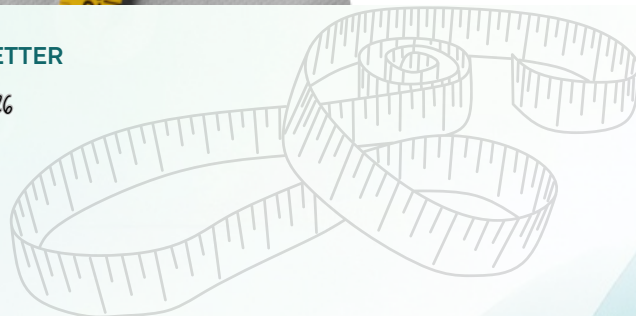

He is currently undergoing mentorship, with Navigators' team who are also part of FLEP field officers in Bauchi.



The training also inspired Suleiman to continue his education. He has decided to return to school because he believes education will help him achieve even greater success.

Suleiman's dream is to continue growing his business and employ an assistant as the number of his customers increases. By doing this, he hopes to create a job opportunity for another young person in his community.
